Spiritual Disciples of Pilgrimage

Spiritual disciples offer to us a means through which we can find meaning in our day and connection to the Divine. Many of the psalms of assent are prayers of pilgrimage, of traveling literally up to the temple in Jerusalem. But we don't have to travel to a specific space to be on a pilgrimage. All we need to do is to carve out time in our day to be with God.

Rather than only offering our petitions to God, allow there to be space for listening. Maybe you will feel more comfortable if you set a timer. Begin with a prayer of thanksgiving and then set a timer for three minutes and embrace the silence.

Continue with a prayer of forgiveness or confession and repeat the silence.

Continue with a prayer for others and listen.

Offer a prayer of what is deep within your heart and then listen. When your prayer is over take time to consider how our words impact ourselves and others. What might God be teaching us about what needs to be said and what does not need to be said.

Notice throughout your day when you are

filling the silence with sounds to distract you from what is going on deep down inside. What would happen if you took time throughout your day to check in with God? It can be as simple as taking 5 minutes to read a psalm, listening to the words, and noticing what they are saying to you in that moment. Return to the words later in the day. Do the same words spark your imagination or thoughts later in the day?

If you journal, write about what you are feeling, what you notice surfacing, emotions, thoughts, observations about yourself. Are they negative or positive? Write what you feel God is saying to you, words you need to hear.

A pilgrimage is ultimately a journey to the center of our being, the heart of God. It is a journey away from cynicism and inaction. In the small village of Chimayó in the mountains of northern New Mexico is a pilgrimage site that offers these words to those who travel there: "If you are a stranger, if you are weary from the struggles of life ... whether you have a broken heart, follow the long mountain road, find a home in Chimayó." ¹

Lent is a time to find the heart of God, the journey might begin with cleaning out the clutter, or cocooning ourselves and doing the hard work of shifting and changing but we have a destination, it is the brilliant light of that first Easter morning where we are captivated by the brilliance and light that it is all we can see.
