

I suggested \$1 a week since they were earning \$10 with their allowance. Once Harry did the math, he thought he should give more, like \$100 a week. He wondered how \$1 could make a difference. I explained to him that it is not about the amount but the intention of giving to the church before you head the store to buy something you want. Like most endeavors, they both started out strong and by the end of the year, Dan and I usually fulfilled the remainder of their pledge.

A central question of stewardship is, does God deserve our best or our left overs? Some of us give out of what we have left at the end of the week or the end of the month, others commit to a certain amount and budget for it either weekly or monthly. I invite you to consider how each act of giving relates to our faithfulness.

As we approach the close of 2025, I encourage you to consider if your offering has matched your commitment to Christ's church and the transforming message of the gospel. This is a deeply personal question and is why I prefer not to know what anyone gives to the church.

I have been through seasons when Dan and I were barely able to make ends meet, so we gave what we could, a measured amount that we budgeted for just as we have budgeted for a certain amount to give when we have a surplus in the bank. 



Giving as a sign of faithfulness by Rev. Leslie Dalstra


When Harry was in elementary school, we began the process of having our children fill out a pledge card for the upcoming year. I suggested \$1 a week since they were earning \$10 with their allowance. Once Harry did the math, he thought he should give more, like \$100 a week. He wondered how \$1 could make a difference. I explained to him that it is not about the amount but the intention of giving to the church before you head the store to buy something you want. Like most endeavors, they both started out strong and by the end of the year, Dan and I usually fulfilled the remainder of their pledge.

A central question of stewardship is, does God deserve our best or our left overs? Some of us give out of what we have left at the end of the week or the end of the month, others commit to a certain amount and budget for it either weekly or monthly. I invite you to consider how each act of giving relates to our faithfulness.

As we approach the close of 2025, I encourage you to consider if your offering has matched your commitment to Christ's church and the transforming message of the gospel. This is a deeply personal question and is why I prefer not to know what anyone gives to the church.

I have been through seasons when Dan and I were barely able to make ends meet, so we gave what we could, a measured amount that we budgeted for just as we have budgeted for a certain amount to give when we have a surplus in the bank. Every year, for the past 27 years, we have increased our giving. Sometimes by \$1 or \$2 and sometimes by increments of \$10 or \$15, or even by \$50 more weekly. 


When Harry was in elementary school, we began the process of having our children fill out a pledge card for the upcoming year. I suggested \$1 a week since they were earning \$10 with their allowance. Once Harry did the math, he thought he should give more, like \$100 a week. He wondered how \$1 could make a difference. I explained to him that it is not about the amount but the intention of giving to the church before you head the store to buy something you want. Like most endeavors, they both started out strong and by the end of the year, Dan and I usually fulfilled the remainder of their pledge.

A central question of stewardship is, does God deserve our best or our left overs? Some of us give out of what we have left at the end of the week or the end of the month, others commit to a certain amount and budget for it either weekly or monthly. I invite you to consider how each act of giving relates to our faithfulness.

As we approach the close of 2025, I encourage you to consider if your offering has matched your commitment to Christ's church and the transforming message of the gospel. This is a deeply personal question and is why I prefer not to know what anyone gives to the church.

I have been through seasons when Dan and I were barely able to make ends meet, so we gave what we could, a measured amount that we budgeted for just as we have budgeted for a certain amount to give when we have a surplus in the bank. 



Giving as a sign of faithfulness by Rev. Leslie Dalstra



I explained to him that it is not about the amount but the intention of giving to the church before you head the store to buy something you want. Like most endeavors, they both started out strong and by the end of the year, Dan and I usually fulfilled the remainder of their pledge.

A central question of stewardship is, does God deserve our best or our left overs? Some of us give out of what we have left at the end of the week or the end of the month, others commit to a certain amount and budget for it either weekly or monthly. 

Giving as a sign of faithfulness by Rev. Leslie Dalstra


When Harry was in elementary school, we began the process of having our children fill out a pledge card for the upcoming year. I suggested \$1 a week since they were earning \$10 with their allowance. Once Harry did the math, he thought he should give more, like \$100 a week. He wondered how \$1 could make a difference. I explained to him that it is not about the amount but the intention of giving to the church before you head the store to buy something you want. Like most endeavors, they both started out strong and by the end of the year, Dan and I usually fulfilled the remainder of their pledge.

A central question of stewardship is, does God deserve our best or our left overs? Some of us give out of what we have left at the end of the week or the end of the month, others commit to a certain amount and budget for it either weekly or monthly. I invite you to consider how each act of giving relates to our faithfulness.

As we approach the close of 2025, I encourage you to consider if your offering has matched your commitment to Christ's church and the transforming message of the gospel. This is a deeply personal question and is why I prefer not to know what anyone gives to the church.

I have been through seasons when Dan and I were barely able to make ends meet, so we gave what we could, a measured amount that we budgeted for just as we have budgeted for a certain amount to give when we have a surplus in the bank. Every year, for the past 27 years, we have increased our giving. Sometimes by \$1 or \$2 and sometimes by increments of \$10 or \$15, or even by \$50 more weekly. Giving as a sign of faithfulness by Rev. Leslie Dalstra


When Harry was in elementary school, we began the process of having our children fill out a pledge card for the upcoming year. I suggested \$1 a week since they were earning \$10 with their allowance. Once Harry did the math, he thought he should give more, like \$100 a week. He wondered how \$1 could make a difference. I explained to him that it is not about the amount but the intention of giving to the church before you head the store to buy something you want. Like most endeavors, they both started out strong and by the end of the year, Dan and I usually fulfilled the remainder of their pledge.

A central question of stewardship is, does God deserve our best or our left overs? Some of us give out of what we have left at the end of the week or the end of the month, others commit to a certain amount and budget for it either weekly or monthly. I invite you to consider how each act of giving relates to our faithfulness.

As we approach the close of 2025, I encourage you to consider if your offering has matched your commitment to Christ's church and the transforming message of the gospel. This is a deeply personal question and is why I prefer not to know what anyone gives to the church.

I have been through seasons when Dan and I were barely able to make ends meet, so we gave what we could, a measured amount that we budgeted for just as we have budgeted for a certain amount to give when we have a surplus in the bank. Every year, for the past 27 years, we have increased our giving. Sometimes by \$1 or \$2 and sometimes by increments of \$10 or \$15, or even by \$50 more weekly. As we have invested in the church through our offering, we have grown in our faith in ways unexpected. I am proud to call First Chrisitan Church in Fort Madison, my home congregation. I am grateful to be in ministry with each and every one of you. My own faith is deepened by your presence, encouragement, and prayers, and frankly that is worth the investment.
